Confirmation

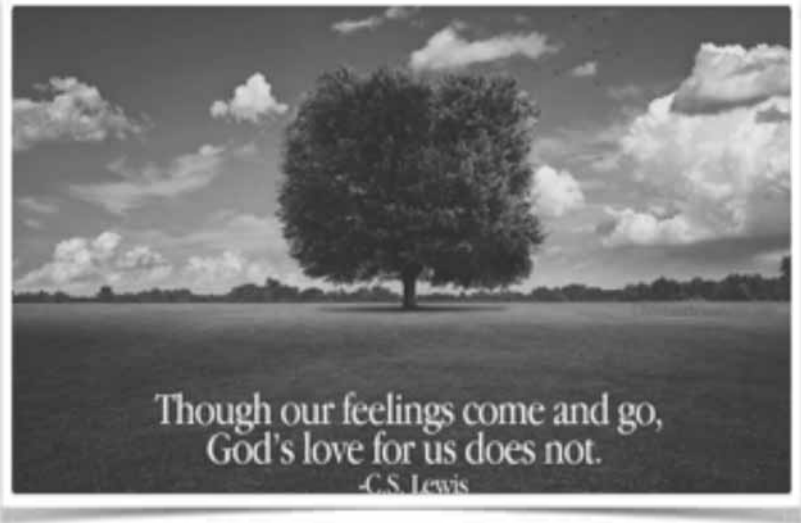
