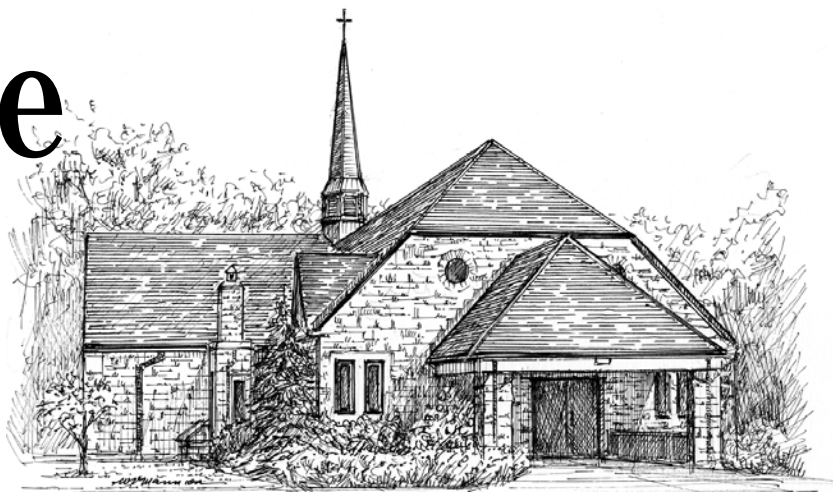

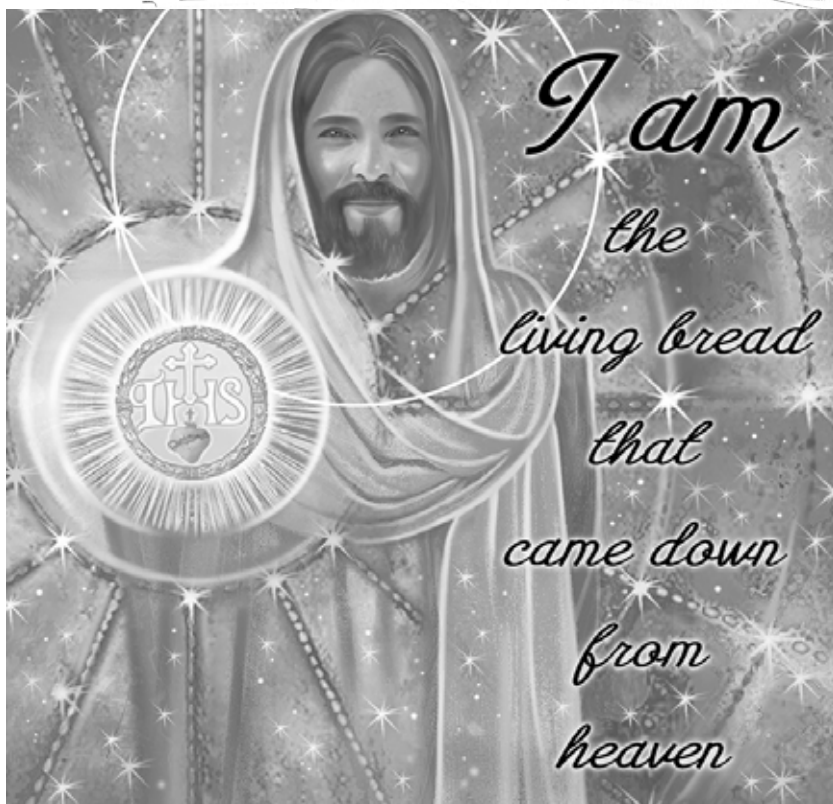

With all that Jesus accomplished during His mission on earth, He transformed this world of ours almost into an anticipated paradise.

Did He not tell disciples "you have my powers, you are my witnesses; go and chase demons, forgive, heal, make disciples, bring peace to households, I am with you till the end of the age"?

Did he not require of all of us to be wearing our baptism garment all the time? Did He not say we are light and salt of the world?

Most importantly, Jesus included disciples in the love relationship He is sharing with the Father: "I am the vine and you are the branches and my Father is the vine grower. I am in my Father and you are in me and I in you"; this sharing continues wondrously through the celebration of the seven Sacraments of the Church.

About the Eucharist which we are celebrating with Solemnity today, Jesus said: "I am the living bread that came down from heaven, whoever eats this bread will live forever" and during the Last Supper, Jesus ordered disciples to continue doing the same.

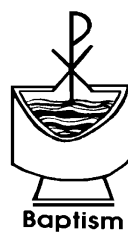

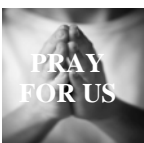

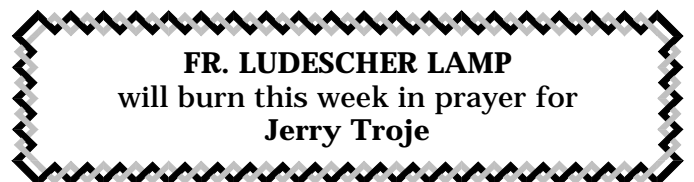


FYI—Renting Tables
