

## MISSION STATEMENT



Today I am using this opportunity to share more about what is happening on the school side of our campus:

**Facilities Projects** Two projects are underway related to updating our heating systems and increasing fresh air flow to the building. Half of the cost of these projects will be paid by the Federal EANS funds (covid funding available to nonpublic schools). The other half will be built into our budget and fundraising efforts. The result will be classrooms where temperature can be more closely controlled and fresh air will circulate throughout the building.

**Eagle Scout Project** Brendan M., a SJS grad, will be building a Mary garden in the back courtyard near the white pine and bird feeders. This circle garden will be a place for prayer and quiet outdoor reading and reflection.

**Endowment Effort** Thanks to several very generous folks we are very close to meeting the challenge to raise \$125,000 to match a donor giving the same amount. This will allow us to begin the first ever endowment for St. Jerome School. There are some people who especially like to support the long-term viability of our school. Endowment giving is a great way to see an investment serve indefinitely. Our endowment will grow over the next years and become a sustaining source of support for our students and their families. We are grateful!

**Theology of the Body Curriculum** Beginning next year our K-8 students will have the Ruah Woods Theology of the Body curriculum integrated into our religion classes. Pope St. John Paul II wrote about Theology of the Body. This curriculum puts this church teaching in the context of our modern world. Children gain an understanding of who God is, who they are as formed in God's image, and how they fit into the world. Our hope is that as children are faced with many questions and wonderings brought on by the world around them, this will provide a strong foundation with which to handle the many things coming at them.

**Raise Right (formerly SCRIP) News**

We are trying to sell the last of our physical gift card inventory. We have 6-\$100 Home Depot physical gift cards to sell. Thanks to our recent buyer for lowering our inventory! The gift cards make great gifts or you can use them on projects I would like to urge you to give Raise Right online a try (just type in Raise Right or Scrip, either works), or with your app on your iPhone or android phone. It is so easy. I went out to Olive Garden with some family members. We each downloaded the e-gift card for Olive Garden and printed them out before we left home. We gave them to our server and they are treated just like cash. You can even tip your server with the gift card if you like. My family bought \$100 worth of the gift cards and we earned \$8 for the church. If you don't have a printer, just use your app on your phone instead which is even easier, and when it comes time to pay your bill, your server will scan the balance on your app and your meal is paid for. No need to hang on to your paper gift certificate, your app maintains your card and balance all on your phone in "your wallet." So if you are out and about and decide to eat or shop, you always have it available on your phone. If it sounds complicated and you would like me to walk you through the process, I would be more than happy to. **St Jerome's code is B89AB59714377** and you will need to enter this the very first time you shop in order to give St Jerome's the credit. Once you do that, you don't have to do that again. It will be automatically set to St. Jerome's. Give it a try, You have nothing to lose and St. Jerome's has everything to gain by your purchases.
