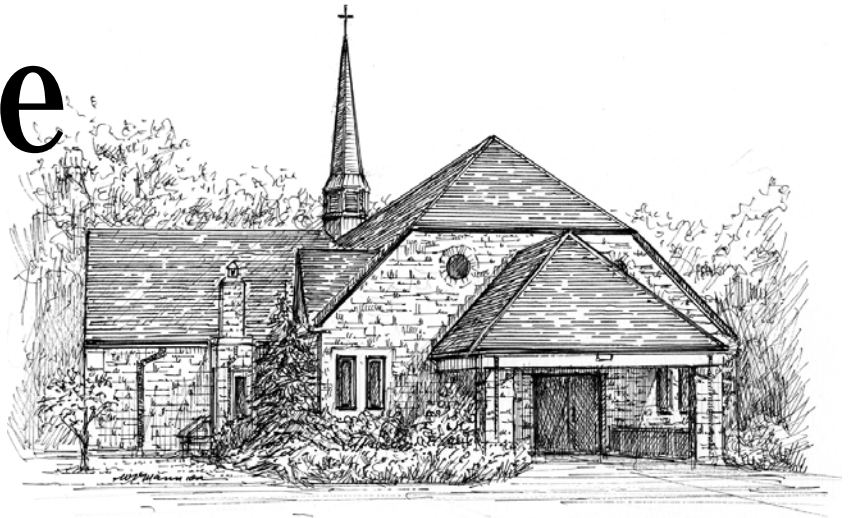

MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR



Dear Brothers and Sisters,
We begin the ordinary season reflecting on the triune identity of our God as Father, Son and Holy Spirit. The mystery that God, the one God, is also three divine persons: Father, Son and Holy Spirit. One substance but three persons. It is really difficult to explain, in fact, impossible to comprehend fully how one God can be in three divine

persons. Its like trying to explain how we can “square that circle”

It really is a divine mystery, not a mathematical problem to solve that God has revealed to us. It is central to our faith because it tells us not just what God has done rather the mystery of the Trinity tells us who God is from all eternity. We desire to be in a personal relationship with God so it is important that we get to know what God reveals to us about himself.

Yes, in three persons, in three distinct times God continually reveals himself to us. It makes us know and experience that God is with us always. He loves, is merciful; and desires that man is saved from sin and death and be one day united with him in his kingdom forever.

Our life in the parish is a continuing discovery of God’s revelation in the three persons. We pray that our journey will move our hearts to a closer connection and relationship with him.

All the events that come into our life as a parish: baptisms, weddings, funerals, graduations, anniversaries, festivals, etc are but avenues to build God’s kingdom in our communities and in our hearts. Whatever we do, we do to glorify God and strengthen the spirit. By our profession and witnessing, we make God’s kingdom a reality in our midst.

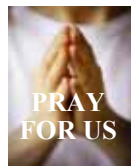
