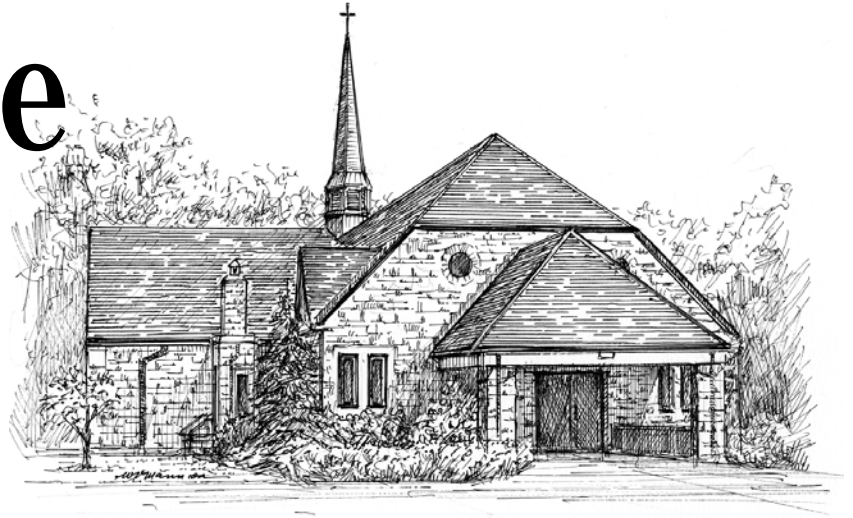

**MISSION STATEMENT**

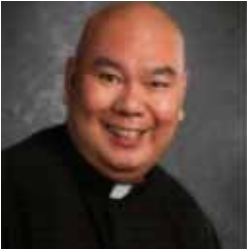

**MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR**



Dear Brothers and Sisters,  
This week we celebrate another gift: the gift of the Eucharist, the mystery of the body and blood, soul and divinity of our Lord Jesus Christ. In our gospel story we look at the feeding of the five thousand. It amazes us how five thousand people were fed from five loaves and two fish. It was a miracle of multiplication. Indeed Jesus miraculously and supernaturally supply his people with food feeding the new Israel. Jesus is the new Moses providing for our journey, his body and blood as nurturing food for our journey in life and in faith. Jesus is the way, the truth and the life of our journey. Without him we cannot finish/complete the race.

Yes, at St. Jerome we journey in faith. We need Jesus in our journey. He is our food. We all need him. Let us be nourished by his food and by his teaching. Moving forward let us share Jesus to others so they can also live and continue to journey. Two important things we need to reflect on: Nourishing our selves in Jesus and energizing our selves so we can also respond to Jesus when he said “feed my lambs.”

Jesus gave a sacrificial offering in his body and blood. That is priesthood. We share the common priesthood with Christ in an unbloody sacrifice of treasure, time and talent. It is a liturgical act based from scripture when we offer the fruits of our labor as an act of sacrifice and gratitude to God for our blessings.

“Where your treasure is, there will your heart be also.” If we are not willing to share our treasure with God, probably because we are not willing to share our heart to him too. WE commonly call this tithing or stewardship. Making a sacrificial offering is not only understood in monetary ways. It includes our sharing our personal time to serve and sharing our talent in the service of others.

As we celebrate the gift of Jesus Christ making a sacrificial offering of his body and blood every Sunday as spiritual nourishment. We know too that we can make a grateful response to him also in the sharing of our time, talent and treasure.

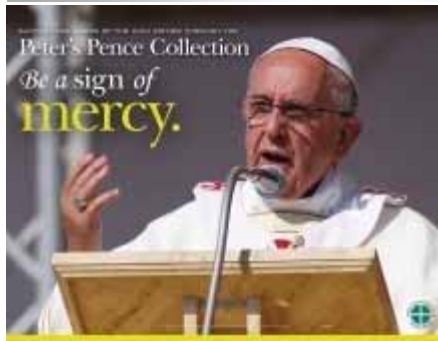
