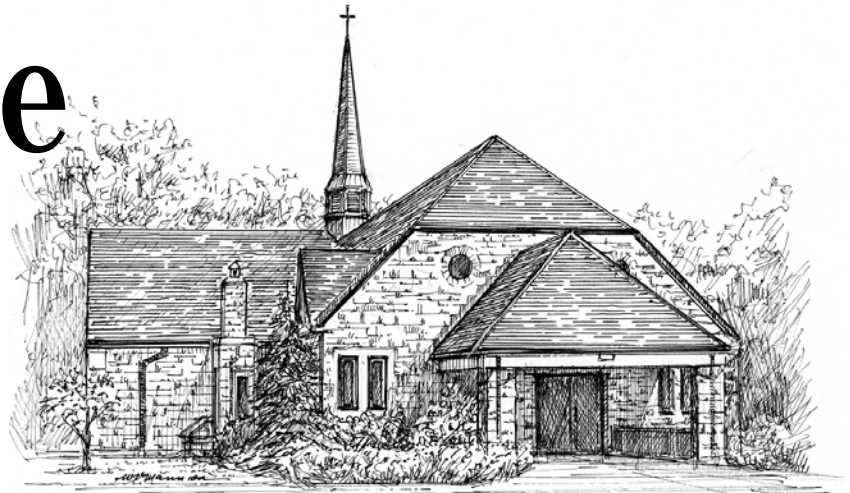



**MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR**



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

What does it mean to be a disciple? What are some of the teachings of Jesus when we answer his call? There are two lessons we hear this weekend. To be a disciple of Jesus us to love him with all our heart, with all our mind and with all our spirit. Nothing should go between.

The only person who is to be loved above your parents is God himself. "Discipleship for the kingdom requires total adherence, total self-gift to Christ, in which everything is going to be given up in order to follow him. Nothing is put ahead of him, even family, even friends, even parents, even children. He's first above all else." There should be no compromise about God's word either. Either you love him or you don't.

What should be our attitude to our enemies? Who are our enemies. Those who want to kill the body and our soul. Should be hate and destroy your enemies? No. His message is to "love your enemies". Enemies do bad things. If you are a child of God, do good things. The spirit of Jesus tells us that "he came not to destroy men's lives, but to save them."

Jesus is challenging our commitment as his disciples. He is challenging the very disposition of our hearts. St Cyril of Alexandria and St. Basil said something about the cost of discipleship: "A person who wishes to become the Lord's disciple must repudiate a human obligation, (a human thought, value or attachment) however honorable it may appear, if it slows us ever so slightly in giving wholehearted obedience we owe to God."

No matter what our state of life may be, we are to live out our discipleship. It would not mean to abandon everything like the apostles or nuns or priests. All of us are taught that nothing, absolutely nothing (relationships or possessions) can ever come ahead of Christ. The cost of discipleship is total.

This is what Jesus meant when he said: "Come, follow me."

Your compliance is evidence of you love and devotion to the house of God and the Blessed Sacrament. Thanks for your cooperation.

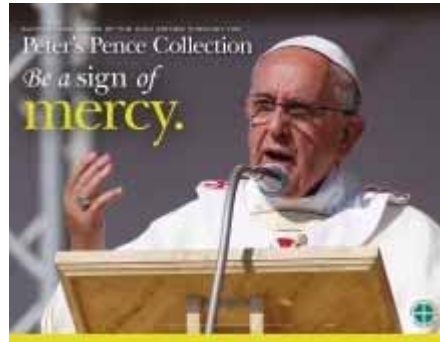

**PETER'S PENCE COLLECTION—June 25-26**

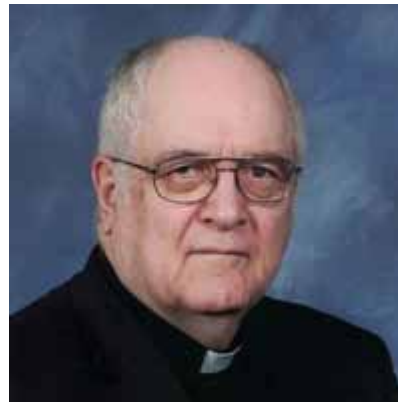
