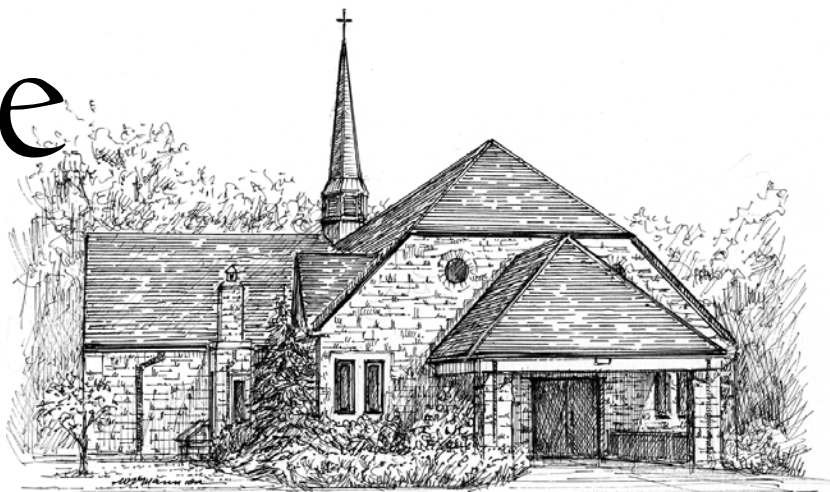

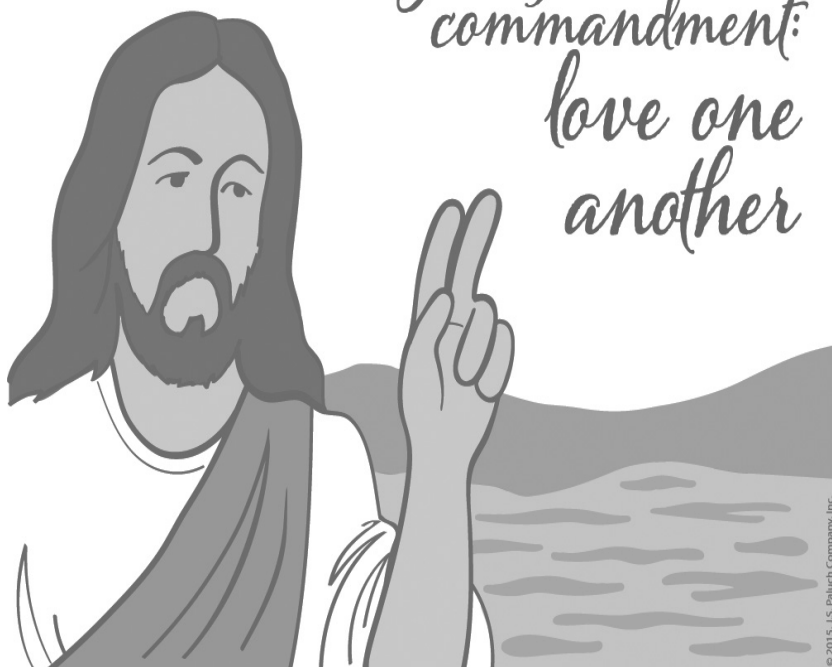

A NEW COMMANDMENT

How can the commandment of love from Jesus be new when love is so popular and so common all over the world?

In the Gospel, it is about loving the way Jesus loves: "remain in my love as I remain in my Father's love."

Jesus' love is a sacrificial love which makes Him ready to lay down His life for those He loves; it is also a transforming love, helping to recognize disciples since it has become their distinctive sign telling everybody that they belong to Jesus; it is a love that resists denials, betrayals, hatred . . . and that takes every opportunity as time to glorify God. It is a love that is communion with Trinity.

It is this type of love that animates disciples like Paul and Barnabas when they are moving from one city to another with the Gospel message, attracting numerous new disciples, praying and fasting before they appoint elders, avoiding to take responsibility for their many miracles, they report them as done by God and they recognize the necessity to undergo many hardships for the sake of the Gospel.

With the new commandment of love, God will dwell with His people, there will be a new heaven and a new earth and there shall be no more death.
