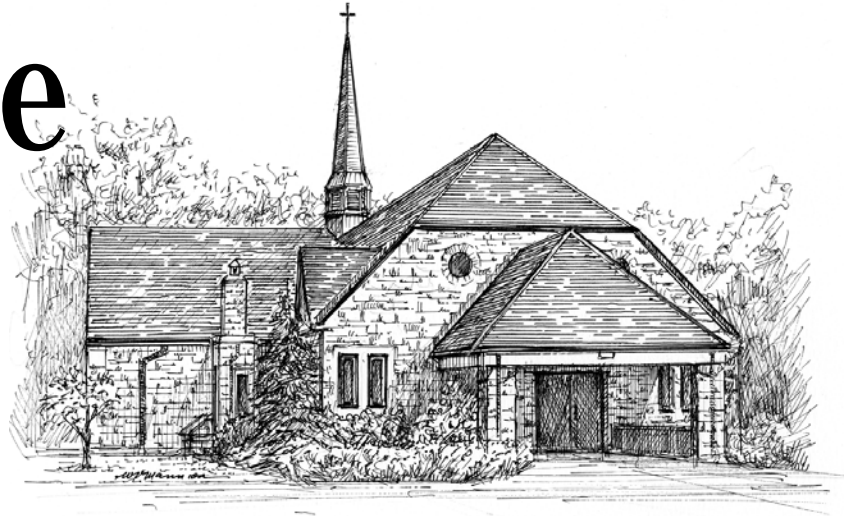

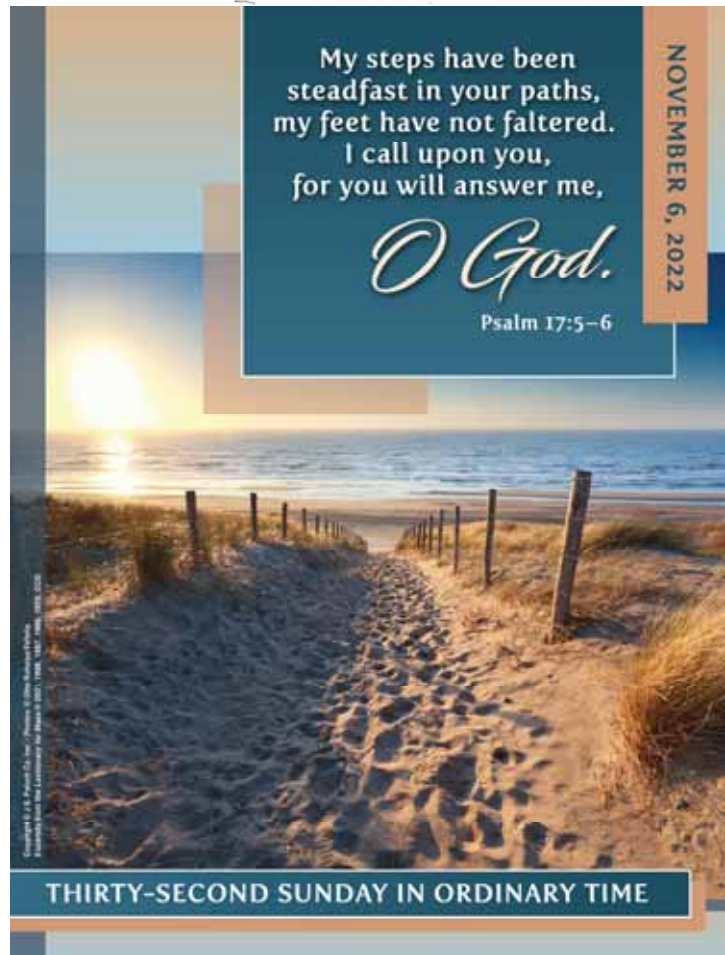

Dear Brothers and Sisters,
 Let us continue to learn more about our faith by listening to Jesus teach about what happens to body and soul after our life here on earth. The soul does continue on after death. Jesus also points us to the reality of the bodily resurrection and the reality of life after death. Therefore we recognize the reality of the hope for a New Creation, a new Heavens and a new Earth. 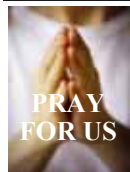
