

## MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

A blessed Easter to everyone!

Let us reflect together on the "empty tomb" of Jesus. Surprisingly the word tomb was mentioned about seven times

in only nine verses. It is quite an important word to celebrate the coming back to life of Jesus.

We heard of the story about how the Roman authorities made sure that the tomb of Jesus was properly sealed and guarded. And behold the women who visited the tomb early morning found it open and the dead body missing. To their amazement they ran back to the disciples and told them what they witnessed. The disciples ran to see the "empty tomb". They saw and believed.

The tomb is the place for the dead. Jesus was in the tomb. After three days, the tomb of Jesus was found empty because his body transcended human death and rose back to life. The promise of life after death was realized first in Jesus and the disciples "saw and believed". This resurrection of Jesus is the living testimony to the truth of his teaching that those who believe in him will have eternal life!






