

You will click on join an existing program and then you will enter the enrollment code B89AB59714377. Click on *enroll*, and then follow the prompts. If you have any questions regarding how to do this, contact me at auglie@usfamily.net. You can pay for your order using a credit card or from you checking account. A small fee will apply each time you purchase something. Some users will purchase scrip once a month and only have to pay 29 cents total, even if they purchase \$1000 worth of cards.
