MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

On the 6th Sunday of Easter there is a very important message from Jesus in the scriptures. It is the importance of a loving relationship between him and his disciples. Jesus is calling his disciples and us to keep his commandments out of love, not out of obligation. Every-

thing that we do, we do out of love. Jesus gave his commandments are his loving gift to us so we can be directed to the path to happiness and of eternal life.

God the Father sends Jesus and the Holy Spirit to be our "paraclete". It comes from two Greek words "para" that means beside and "kaleo" which means call. Put together, it means called to one's side, somebody that comes to your side and stands by your side in order to defend you or advocate on your behalf. The Holy Spirit stands by you to give you truth, certainty, strength and counsel. The truth is our defense and guide. Jesus is the first paraclete. The Holy Spirit is the other paraclete. So Jesus did not leave his disciples empty handed. The Holy Spirit was sent as their guide and protector. He was not abandoning them.

On the feast of the Pentecost, which is just a few weeks away. We will remember Jesus fulfilling the promise of the advocate when he "breathe" on them. This week is a good time to prepare ourselves for the celebration by learning more about the Holy Spirit.

Let us also learn something about the sacrament of confirmation through the first reading. Let me quote Brant Petre: "if you look at the New Testament, will you find the word confirmation? No, absolutely not. But do you find the reality there? Absolutely, yes, you see it right here in Acts 8. So what is Confirmation? It is a special grace of Holy Spirit that can only be given by the Apostles and their successors, and it's tied to the ritual of the laying on of hands. It's different than Baptism, but it's tied to Baptism and it completes Baptism, and it gives them this grace of the Holy Spirit to go out and bear witness themselves.

Yes, we do have explanations of our faith. Yet more importantly we have to live it out ourselves in our day to day lives. Jesus also asks us the question: "do you love me?"
