

MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

I pray that today, as you get into the church, you will have some quite time to dispose yourself for worship. I also hope you will have time to reflect how you have concretely experienced God's love for you. This

is kind of a follow up to what I shared last week regarding many opportunities of evangelizing by sharing our life experiences with God.

The Solemnity of the Ascension is being celebrated this Sunday. Traditionally Thursday would have been the 40th day after we celebrated Resurrection Sunday. It is moved to Sunday so that the wider community can remember and celebrate.

In our creed we profess that "he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father." This is one of the articles of our faith that we profess therefore this is something we should reflect on and understand.

It is very important to understand that in the resurrection, on Easter Sunday, the body of Jesus comes to life again in a new glorified state. The event of the Ascension, 40 days later, is, as the Catechism teaches us, "the irreversible entry of Jesus' humanity into divine glory." Let us also be aware that the ascension of Jesus was both body and soul. We believe that "Christ is 'seated bodily at the right hand of the Father." That's what we mean when we say in the Apostle's Creed, "he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father."

Please give ample attention to the first reading that is giving us an account of the ascension of Jesus in the book of the Acts of the Apostles. For 40 days Jesus was preparing his disciples for his departure, kind of a transition period to Ascension.

It was a time to purify their misunderstandings about the nature of the kingdom in preparation for their future ministry. Jesus ascended into heaven in a cloud to manifest his divinity.

Let us continue our formation towards discipleship. It is a process of attuning of our heart to the heart of God. It is about forming our mind into the mind of God. It is a process, it is formation. It is what we are working in our parish: formation.
