

MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

As we celebrate the solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, at St. Jerome we also celebrate the first holy communion of seven of our children. Let us give emphasis this week why the Eucha-

rist is central to our faith life especially that seven of our children now begins their Eucharistic life.

This feast is important to us. Our catechism teaches us that the Eucharist is "the source and summit of the Christian life." The Lord's supper is NOT JUST A MEMORI-AL of Jesus. The reason why the Eucharist is the source and summit, it is the fount of our Christian life is because we believe that Jesus is truly, really present, body and soul and divinity. The Eucharist therefore is not something. The Eucharist is someone: Jesus Christ.

From the gospel reading this week we hear Jesus identifying himself as bread from heaven. He calls us not just to believe but to eat his flesh. His listeners were horrified and rejected the idea of him becoming the bread of life. It was like cannibalism. Despite the reaction, Jesus did not back down. In fact Jesus emphasized some more the realism of his presence under the form of food and drink, that he was the real food and drink. Then on the last supper he repeated the same making his body and blood real food and real drink. That is necessary for us to have eternal life, Jesus said.

It is important for us to endeavor to learn about the Eucharist. I encourage you to register at formed.com and learn more about the Eucharist. In our spiritual journey, Jesus in the Eucharist is our lifeline.
