MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

In the journey of faith, we are all in the road to discover and learn about Jesus Christ and our relationship with him. By virtue of our baptism are called to follow him by preaching the good news of salvation. This Sunday Jesus is teaching us about what it takes to be a disciple.

So very essential in our discipleship is to learn and form our hearts to a deep love, a love for God that can transcend a love for a parent or a child. This kind of love is echoed in the book of Deuteronomy 6 known as the "Shema": "Hear, O Israel: The LORD our God is one LORD; and you shall love the LORD your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your might.

This radical form of love even goes deeper. It calls for an openness to the many sufferings that come in life for believing and loving God. Just as Jesus took up his heavy cross we are to do the same openly. As disciples we are to embrace and accept the sufferings that come with being united in Christ.

Discipleship therefore is about love and sacrifice. They come together. To be a disciple is learning to love and embrace suffering. To love God is also to desire his kingdom. To love God is to move forward to eternal life. A disciple's treasure is eternal life to the point that you are willing to lose everything only to find the "pearl of great price". In a way it is saying you are willing to lose all things in this world in order to find and attain eternal life. It is losing something in order to find everything that really matters.

IN another perspective those who receive the word of God acknowledges and accepts the proclaimer. The missionary apostle who proclaims God is a holy instrument sent with authority. Whoever receives them is also receiving the one who sent them, Jesus Christ, who was also sent by the Father. They will receive properly in return for their openness.

This is a good reminder for us as disciples who are being sent and also as receivers of the word and its proclaimer. We can we formed and transformed by the word that we receive and then proclaim.


This year our Kindergarten teachers hosted a graduation. Parents and grandparents were so happy to see their sweet little ones mark this milestone.
