

MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

We hear this Sunday a teaching of Jesus about himself and his relationship with the Father. This occurred after he was rejected by the Galileans in Chorazin and Bethsaida. Here we are given a glimpse of his

identity.

Jesus was saying a thanksgiving prayer to the Father for revealing something (the truth) to the childlike and hidden from the learned. What is this invisible reality that's being hidden from the proud and revealed to the humble? It is about the identity of Jesus so closely linked to the Father.

One time Jesus asked his disciples who they said he was. They came up with some answers. He revealed his deepest essence to those hearts that were open to listen and receive him: the humble and the lowly. He is the eternal Son of the Father. Only the Father and the Son knew this and to whomever the Son revealed himself.

This is so deep a reality of Jesus and the Father. A great mystery that has been revealed to hearts that are disposed to this reality. So when the Galileans rejected Jesus, they have also rejected the Father. They had hearts not open to the reality of the Father and the Son.

Our church teaches that the truth of the Trinity is a great mystery that the human mind cannot fully grasp. It is something that transcends logic and reason. It is a reality of God that cannot be known to us humanly unless God himself reveals or shows it to us.

Jesus had a nice invitation for all human beings: "If you're heavily laboring from all the concerns of this world, come to me and I will give you rest." Jesus is inviting us: "You desire to take a rest from the burdens of this world, take my yoke, it is still a yoke to carry but it is lighter and will give you rest. Choose God therefore! His yoke is the cross, and only in the cross that you get to resurrection. Take the course of Jesus' life. There is still suffering and he is teaching us that the suffering is much better in gentleness and meekness. In the wisdom of God you actually will find rest and peace.

St. Jerome is looking for someone to coordinate live streaming of the mass on the weekends.


