

Our Archdiocese has journeyed quite significantly praying and discerning how to better serve the people of God. A synod was organized and called upon its members to participate in prayer and

reflection and share their thoughts and concerns and hopes for our church. It has been over a year now since our shepherd, Archbishop Bernard Hebda sent us his post synodal pastoral letter "You Will Be My Witnesses" as a summary of the outcomes of the discussions and now a direction for our archdiocese. We are so grateful for the guidance of the Holy Spirit and we continue to pray of enlightenment as now our church endeavors to move forward.

We move into the process of implementing the Synod. Following the footsteps of Jesus Christ who selected twelve disciples, each parish have selected 12 to form the Synod Evangelization Team (SET). In our parish, nine have responded to the call and went through a seven week "Discipleship Training", setting their minds and hearts, in prayer and reflection, to the task of discipleship in leading our parish in implementing the synod directions in our local church.

The team (SET) endeavored to make a vision on how to move forward. Now our parish pray and ass the Lord 'to send more workers in his vineyard". Small "faith" groups was one of the top voted upon propositions during the Synod "to foster connection for experiencing the love of God." Together with the Pastor the team will choose "small group leaders" to help us make this into a reality.

Like Jesus teaching his listeners with his parables, we shall continue to find ways and means to proclaim the good news of salvation. May God continue to bless and guide the works of our hands

Dear St. Jerome Parishioners,



#### **SCRIP**

**Have travel plans?** Don't forget you can buy Scrip online to purchase your airline tickets. Delta, Southwest and American Airlines all give back a minimum of 4% to St Jerome's if you purchase your airline tickets using the e-



gift certificates online. When it comes time to pay for your ticket, simply indicate you are paying by gift card and enter the gift card number for your payment You can really rack up the cash for St Jerome's this way. The same goes for buying electronic cards for hotel stays. Marriott, Hilton, Sheraton and Best Western all give percentages back to St Jerome's if you pay for some or all of your hotel bill using electronic Scrip gift cards. I have purchased both airline and hotel electronic gift cards through Scrip and they were easy to use and no problem whatsoever when I went to purchase my tickets online or pay for my hotel at the end of my stay. If you take Uber rides locally or when you travel, you can buy electronic gift cards for that as well online. All I do is purchase the ecard online, and then add the amount I purchased to my Uber phone app. The next time I take an Uber ride, I use my gift card and the ride is paid for. Perhaps your adult children use Uber. It is a great gift for them when they travel or to use locally. St Jerome's benefits every time you purchase Scrip. Won't you give it a try? 
#### LIVE STREAMING THE MASS
