

MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Happy Sunday to everyone!!

Jesus uses parables to reveal the kingdom. It is meant to lead us to the supernatural and invisible reality of the kingdom because the kingdom of God is a mysterious reality. It is not what we

think or imagine to be. The parable of the mustard seed tells is that the kingdom of God starts small and it grows. When it begins to be rooted it will spread. It is like the yeast of the corn in the fields that grow we do not know how. In parables Jesus is not talking about agriculture. He is talking about the reality of God's kingdom.

The wheat and the weeds reveals to us about the reality of God's kingdom: a mystery of righteousness and sin. It is interesting that God allows the good and the bad seed to grow together side by side. But at a certain point one could recognize the difference. The harvester then gathers the good ones and destroys the bad. It doesn't mean then that God is not aware of the evil that exists. God will do something about it at the end of time. The kingdom may look like it is a mix of wheat and weed. There are good plants and bad as well. Jesus is telling us that in the world there is good and evil until the very end.

"The church at once is holy and always in need of purification.... In everyone, the weeds of sin will still be mixed with the good wheat of the gospel until the end of time" (CCC827)

This parable is also about the state of our souls. There is always the battle and struggle of the good and the sinful. The church is a mixed bag of wheat and weeds. So do our own persons. We will always be in a journey to nurture the seed of wheat of righteousness and uproot the weed of sinfulness in our hearts.

We rely on the mercy and love of God. God is forbearing and patient with us. We journey through time to repent and be formed.

Have travel plans? Don't forget you can buy Scrip online to purchase your airline tickets. Delta, Southwest and American Airlines all give back a minimum of 4% to St Jerome's if you purchase your airline



tickets using the e-gift certificates online. When it comes time to pay for your ticket, simply indicate you are paying by gift card and enter the gift card number for your payment You can really rack up the cash for St Jerome's this way. The same goes for buying electronic cards for hotel stays. Marriott, Hilton, Sheraton and Best Western all give percentages back to St Jerome's if you pay for some or all of your hotel bill using electronic Scrip gift cards. If you take Uber rides locally or when you travel, you can buy electronic gift cards for that as well online. All I do is purchase the ecard online, and then add the amount I purchased to my Uber phone app. The next time I take an Uber ride, I use my gift card and the ride is paid for. Perhaps your adult children use Uber. It is a great gift for them when they travel or to use locally. St Jerome's benefits every time you purchase Scrip. Won't you give it a try? 
LIVE STREAMING THE MASS
