






WELCOME TO THE CHURCH OF ST. JEROME

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Dear St. Jerome Parishioners,

MNSAA (Minnesota Schools Accreditation Association) requires our Catholic school to prepare a strategic plan every 3-5 years and report on progress. Our priorities for the 2023-2024 school year are:

Improve communication between the school and the parish. I hear that there is a perception that the school is "separate" from the parish. My intent is not for that to be the case. The school has grown and is raising more money in the past 6 years. We need to raise money as many of our families require a lot of tuition assistance. I treasure our parishioners and our identity as a parish school. We are a bit different, though, as many of our students do not attend our parish. WE WOULD LOVE TO EDUCATE ALL OF THE CHILDREN OF OUR PARISH! We need to keep communication open. Please verify and ask for more information if you wonder about the school. I am happy to have many conversations.

Improve staff and faculty salaries. The truth is that we cannot compete for teachers at the rate we pay. Our dedicated staff and faculty deserve a just wage. They are amazing and we want to be able to keep them.

Expand Advancement Efforts to include major gifts. Continue to exceed fundraising goals for the Annual Fund and Spring Fundraiser.

Improve our use of data to positively influence academic achievement and growth.

Implement SCREEN STRONG, an Archdiocesan recommended program aimed at developing healthy and safe use of technology and social media. There is a student and family component.

Begin to implement recommendations from our school safety audit and seek grants to help pay for needed changes.

2nd grade is a wonderful age to teach because children are still so in love with school and they are very eager to learn. In our Catholic school it is a year of sacraments: First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion. Teaching the whole child, academics, virtue and the beauty of our faith is very rewarding. DeMontreville RETREATS


