

MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

In his post-synodal pastoral letter "You Will Be My Witnesses", the Archbishop talked about the washing of the feet that happened at the upper room. He said that the action of Jesus washing the feet of his disciples was a humble gesture of selfgiving service to heal, to show love and to

cleanse and purify. The washing to the feet reveals that "love must be expressed concretely". Jesus washed "real feet of real people".

In the Jewish tradition, washing of the feet was a gesture of hospitality and welcome. "In attending to the need of the other, we open ourselves to the mystery of the other." In listening, like Jesus, we welcome and receive the other. Thus washing of the feet sends a message "you are loved and you are welcome", it affirms and it heals.

It came out during the synod process the desire for an experience, for "connection", a "relationship" with God through his church. Parishes are called to endeavor as a foot washing action, to "begin the process of creating and growing a small group ministry that fosters personal relationships, build community, and provides formation to help parish members grow as joyful missionary disciples of Christ."

How will small group ministry help us in our need to grow in a "personal relationship with Christ? How do I build a connection with my church?

In small groups we meet friends. We get to listen to their faith sharing and realize we are all in the same faith journey. We get to be affirmed and sometimes we learn from them. We can be encouraged and challenged. We are heard of our struggles and doubts and learn we are not alone. We can see how God's grace in others and in ours. It makes faith journey real and challenging.


