



#### MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

A lawyer, during the time of Christ was a person who was expert of the Torah. For the Jews, "The Law" is the law of God that is found in the Torah. There are 613 laws that can be found in 5 old testament books that compose the Torah. So the lawyer asked Jesus: Which of the 613

laws is the greatest, the most important? Jesus' answer was: "you shall the Lord your God with all your heart, soul and might". It's an invitation to a total gift of self to God. Then Jesus gave a second commandment: "You shall love your neighbor as yourself".

Everything in the scriptures is about these two commandments. These two commandments sum up the Jewish laws. The first reading gives us a glimpse of the "love of neighbor especially our vulnerable neighbors. Jesus emphasizes that we should not exploit the poor.


These two laws lay the foundation of our church's work: giving opportunities to all our members to love God and how to express our love of neighbor. We call this faith formation and social concerns. It will always be a continuing effort to find ways and means so that we, together, will be able to establish a personal relationship with God. The second will even be more meaningful because our love for neighbor is rooted in love of God, the God of truth, peace and justice.

That is what is at the heart of the virtue of charity: love of God and neighbor. The ten commandments is an expression of these love. The Decalogue becomes the foundation of Christian morality.

Today as we remember World Mission Sunday let us participate in the missionary cooperation plan of our church, we make our own practice of charity by praying for the missions and sharing our resources for the missions.

We shall also continue in our journey desiring for a deeper and closer relationship with Jesus and responding to share the love of God to our brothers and sisters in need.


