

MINISTIES OF THE CHURCH

There are many ministries of the parish that are not part of the mass. Here are a few:

Environmental Committee

Cleaning Angels

Faith Formation

Faith formation includes religious education of children not in our school, adult bible studies and adult faith formation and OCIA—bringing adults into the Catholic faith.


Funeral Luncheons



Music ministry

Music is an essential element of liturgy, inspiring people to praise God with one voice in a way the spoken word cannot. St. Jerome is blessed with a vibrant group of musicians forming various ensembles to serve the community. There are many opportunities at St. Jerome for the young and the old to share their musical gifts.

- Parish Choir Teens through adults. The choir sings at the 9:30 a.m. Sunday Masses.
- Contemporary Group Teens through adults. The Contemporary Group sings for the 4:30 Saturday Masses.
- Children's Choir $-2^{nd} 8^{th}$ graders. The Children's Choir sings for a few Masses during the school calendar year.
- **Handbell Choir** The Handbell Choir is open to teens through adults that have experience reading music.
- Instrumentalists Musicians with at least 5 years of experience are welcome and encouraged to play: flutes, violins, trumpets, trombones, etc. are needed for special liturgies as well as to accompany the choirs.
