



MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

We have reflected on Jesus as a healer and more powerful than the evil. Most especially, Jesus is a healer. In the healing of Peter's mother-in-law we come to notice that Jesus was also attentive to the smaller sufferings of human life, the basic things that we all struggle like a

fever which was not life threatening but deters her from rendering service or use of her potentials. So this is a simple proof that the healing of Jesus restores man's potential to be alive and to be of service to others.

Yes, Jesus healed the sick and expelled demons. By his actions he brought about the potentials of the people. Because his healing also liberated persons from the evil that stifled man's goodness and possibilities. Even today Jesus continues to heal and to expel demons.

It is also significant to note that Jesus had a prayer life too. He would often pray alone early in the morning or late at night when it is quite and away from the noise and haste of daily living. Many times the only chance we can have to be alone is either early in the morning or late at night, and so those are good times for prayer. We see here that even Jesus needs to get away for a while, and be by himself, and be alone with his father in prayer. It is a good time to reflect on our work and what has happened to us, to keep us focused to our goal.

While Jesus was successful in his ministry, He did not stay in one place too long because his mission was to bring the good news of God's kingdom to as many people as possible within his appointed area. His mission was clear to him.

Our life here on earth are full of drudgery yet we can be hopeful because our Jesus heals and expels demons. Jesus is the healer. He comes into this world not just to cast out the great power of the devil. He comes into this world to touch the misery of human life. He comes into this world to heal us, even down to the very small things like the misery of a fever, of ordinary human illness.
