



MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR



Dear Brothers and Sisters.

Let us journey through the third Sunday of Lent reflecting on the story of Jesus cleansing the temple in Jerusalem. It happened on the week of his passion and death, probably the day after his glorious entrance to Jerusalem we now celebrate as palm Sunday.

It took place during the spring time of the Passover feast, a celebration of thanksgiving remembering the exodus from Egypt and the deliverance from Pharaoh in the famous story of the red

The money changers and those selling oxen and sheep had a legitimate reason to be in the temple. They had a legitimate role of helping pilgrims to convert their money from Roman or Greek to Jewish denomination. The travelers from afar will need to procure their sacrificial offerings of sheep or oxen. Thus they were performing service for the travelers who came from far away.

So what was the reason for the strong reaction of Jesus? Because they were setting up their tables in the temple area that was a worship space. Their work were effectively robbing the worshippers of the space and the disposition for prayer in the house of the Father. And so Jesus drove them out and said stop making my father's house a house of trade, because people can't pray in a marketplace.

That place was set apart for prayer, for people to commune with their God. It was a sacred place. Jesus, consumed by his zeal, for he loves the temple so much, can't bear to see its holiness desecrated by turning it into just one more market.

Residents from Jerusalem were questioning him "what right have you to do that?"

Jesus is the Son of God. Then he referred to what was going to happen to him, his death and resurrection to establish his authority.

Let us continue to proceed with our Lenten encounter of Jesus remembering who Jesus is and the importance of keep a place of prayer holy and constantly coming to God's temple to commune with him.


