



Dear Brothers and Sisters.

This fourth Sunday of Easter is quite significant for you and me. Our universal church celebrates today "World Day of Prayer for Vocations". It is a day to remember that God has given us, as precious members of his pilgrim church, an invitation, a call to be part of his lov-



- Click on Join an existing program
- Enter enrollment code B89AB59714377
- Click on enroll button
- Type in your first and last name only and click next
- Add your email and create a password
- Pick your 2 security questions and fill in your answers
- Set up your recovery phone (your mobile phone) and click


