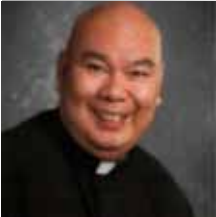




WELCOME TO THE CHURCH OF ST. JEROME

MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR



Dear Sisters and Brothers,

It is significant for us as a parish to celebrate the first communion of our five students on the Sunday we remember and celebrate the solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Jesus Christ.

Yes, Jesus' body and blood offered so that we can be redeemed from sin and eternal damnation. That body and blood sacrificed in payment for death and gained us eternal life!

All of this week's readings are focused on the Passover event. It sends us the message of "a covenant relationship". In the old testament it was sealed with the blood of the lamb, whose body was shared in a meal. In the new covenant Jesus Christ elevated and transformed the covenant reality with his own body and blood saying "do this in memory of me." He is the living sacrifice of the new covenant.

As Catholics, the Eucharist is at the very foundation of our faith. We need to get to know Jesus in a personal way and learn what we believe in the presence of Jesus in the Eucharist.
