MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR



Dear Sisters and Brothers,

As we move through the second half of the calendar year lets continue to celebrate the greatness of God and give thanks for his gifts to humanity. Let us reflect on Jesus' healings as God's desire to preserve, protect and enhance life. The healing of the

hemorrhage of a woman and the restoration to life of Jairus' daughter tells us of how Jesus values life and wants to protect and enhance it. Jesus is a healer and a restorer of life.

Our God is a God of life. He created it. God did not make death. Human beings do who, through our sins, bring death into the world and make death a part of our human existence.

PRINCIPAL'S CORNER

Dear St. Jerome Parishioners,

Here's a quick update on school related items:

- Our field is leveled (almost) and we will be seeding it in mid-July and employing a watering schedule to help it grow well. This is not a regulation sized field, rather a safe playing field for the students to play soccer and for our PE teacher to run outdoor classes.
- The school is getting new keys for all of the doors as a part of our safety improvements. We'll also be working with Fr. Victor and his safety/security committee to look at what additional improvements we need to plan for. Later in the summer we will be adding a protective covering to the front windows of the school and office. We'll also be putting a camera and magnetic door system on the main front doors so people need to be identified to be admitted into the school.
- Our summer program is going full blast! This week they had a water day and conducted a car wash. It was wet, wild and crazy. So much fun...just like summer should be.
- The same generous donation that funded the field upgrade is also funding new flooring in our preschool area. That will be installed right before the start of the new school year.

We are grateful for opportunities to improve our physical space and work to ensure the safety of our students, staff and parishioners while on the grounds.
