



MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR



Dear Sisters and Brothers,

We begin the second half of the year celebrating the gift of freedom and moving forward in joyfully learning more about Jesus Christ and his life enriching lessons for daily living and spiritual formation. In the next two weeks your pastor will also

take a break from ministerial duties to join in a Priests' bible conference and in the National Eucharistic Congress. This is part of the priest's personal enrichment and self care.

Jesus was a great prophet. He preached and he showed miracles in many places. Many people believed and followed him. But in his hometown in Nazareth, he was rejected. His own townspeople heard him but chose not to believe. As they closed their hearts from him he cannot perform any miracles there.

"Familiarity breeds contempt" or the scandal of familiarity is but a great temptation against openness. It is when we are at a situation when we know too much details about another to the point that we form our opinion about them. We sometimes call is "bias", a personal opinion for or against.

Jesus was met with rejection and doubt because "isn't he a carpenter, the son of Mary?" He isn't a priest or a scribe or a Pharisee. He is just a laborer, an ordinary day laborer. It was almost like scandalous for them, having a hard time reconciling an ordinary laborer can become a preacher and a miracle worker.

Today, personal opinion is big. People like to see things around how they think about it. There is that great temptation to think about Jesus according to how "I' see him. Its putting Jesus in a box. Our challenge is to see Jesus "as he is", allowing things to be "as they are".

It is important to see Jesus as he is. The loving, merciful, faithful and just God. We need to teach our hearts to allow Jesus to be as he is by himself.

Instructions for how to set up SCRIP so you can both purch or reload your cards at home.



- Type in *Raise Right* on your web browser
- Click on Join an existing program
- Enter enrollment code B89AB59714377
- Click on *enroll* button
- Type in your first and last name only and click next
- Add your email and create a password
- Pick your 2 security questions and fill in your answers
- Set up your recovery phone (your mobile phone) and click on what method you prefer-text or phone call and then
 - you will receive a 6 digit code you will enter
- Click on get started

YOU CAN ONLY ORDER EGIFT CARDS OR RELOAD NEW GIFT CARDS BOUGHT THROUGH RAISE RIGHT DURING ONE OF OUR PHYSICAL GIFT CARD SALES. YOU CAN NOT ORDER A PHYSICAL GIFT CARD THROUGH THIS SITE BECAUSE IT WILL COST THE CHURCH \$11 TO HAVE IT MAILED TO CHURCH AND WE WOULD LOSE MONEY.

HARVEST PACK— Aug. 14



Harvest Pack is almost here! Harvest Pack is back for its 4th straight year at St Jerome's on Wednesday, August 14th from 6 to 8 pm. This year, our plan is to pack 20,000 meals for our food insufficient sisters and brothers in other lands. If we do so, that means we will have

purchased and served over 80,000 meals in four years. The cost of each meal is 30 cents, and that goes a long way towards feeding the hungry with a healthy and vitamin enriched rice meal. In order to accomplish this, we need your help. We will be looking for donations to pay for the food to make the meals, and then we need your caring hands to help package the meals. This only takes about 2 hours of your time and before you know it, the work is done and the food is boxed and ready to go to the warehouse until it is shipped to its destination. We would love to have 100 people helping us at this event. Please ask your friends, family members, and neighbors to come as well. The more help we have, the quicker the work gets done. For those who like to use their muscles, we will also be looking for help from 4 to 6 pm to unload the Harvest Pack truck and set up the gym for the food packing. We will soon be having Sign-Up Genius on the parish website for you to sign up as well as a sign-up board at church or you can call the parish office to sign up. A donation page will also be on the parish website. If you would prefer to donate without using the website, please make out a check to St Jerome and put it in an envelope marked Harvest Pack in the collection basket. Any gift you can make is greatly appreciated. Looking forward to a great night with you and Harvest Pack.
