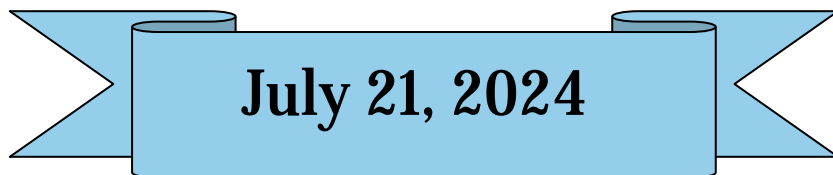
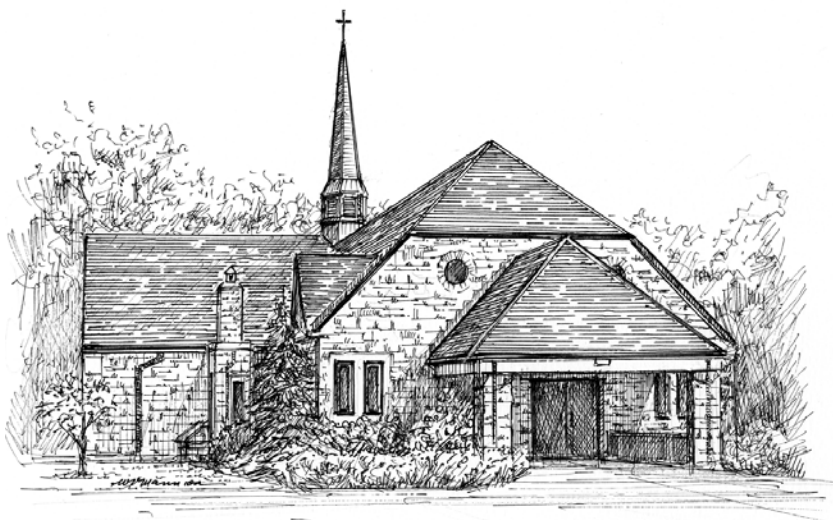

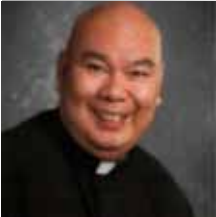




WELCOME TO THE CHURCH OF ST. JEROME

MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR



Dear Sisters and Brothers,

From last week's gospel message we learn that it is Jesus who calls and sends us to mission. It is always important that we bear in mind being called by God and be clear about the mission he is giving us.

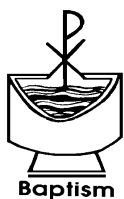
This week we learn that the apostles came back to Jesus after their first apostolic mission and gave him a detailed report of all they have done and taught. This point in the gospel story sends us a message of the importance of reporting back after our ministry to the church.

We also see the humanity of Jesus inviting his apostles to "come away and rest". After their missionary endeavor of doing good works and proclaiming the gospel Jesus recognizes they "need to rest". They need to recuperate, to be refreshed in body, mind and spirit. They need to come to a peaceful and restful place away from the people for rest, rejuvenation and healing.

Yet the demand for the kind of work that they do make it so difficult to "come away and rest even just for a while." The people need to hear the gospel, the people need healing. Deep inside their hearts people are longing for truth, healing, compassion and love. Jesus sees the heart of the people "they are like sheep without a shepherd." And that's really the key line of this particular gospel, like sheep without a shepherd. Jesus sees the crowd lost, his first response is to tell them the truth, is to teach them the truth, because he recognizes that what these people are ultimately hungering for. That is the cry of the poor, the need of the people. That is the urgency of the mission of Jesus Christ.

Yes, that mission continues in our midst and the need is great. We never stop from working yet from time to time our missionaries need to rest. There is a need to "come away" to remain energized, focused and strong.

CHURCH FIRE UPDATE

We are a month and a half after the fire. All the damaged items have been removed from the basement. We are entering the reconstruction phase.

In Ludescher Hall the ceiling tiles have been replaced and a new window ordered. This room will be the quickest to rebuild. At a minimum it needs flooring and wall paint to be useable.

The middle room, which took the most damage is a clean slate. If you have ideas for it, please submit to the parish office.

Here are a few ideas to get you thinking,

In no particular order: **(these are ideas, not decisions)**

- Take the wall out between the two rooms to make the room bigger. Maybe add a movable wall.
- Don't take the wall out, but add another set of doors to make the opening bigger.
- Replace the carpet with vinyl flooring or something similar.
- We have a need to store music items and quilting items. One group gets the brides room, one gets a walk-in closet.
- Mount a tv on the wall for small groups.
- Make a space for religious education
- Make a space for small children
- Add couches for small groups

Thanks to all of you SCRIP physical gift card shoppers, St Jerome's earned close to \$250 during our June sale. With our physical gift card sales and online Scrip orders, we made \$2600 in "free money" for St Jerome last year, and are on track to earning that or even more this year. It is so incredibly easy to use a gift card. If you eat at Panera, Olive Garden, Outback or Chili's, the church receives 8% or more back on the card purchase. If you spent \$50 at Outback for dinner for two, you would make \$5 for the church. You can use the gift card to tip as well. If you buy prescriptions at Walgreens, CVS or Walmart, you can buy a gift card for those stores and earn money for church. People who have bought SCRIP online have told me it is so easy to use, and they feel good knowing they are earning money for church from places they normally go to anyway. Please give it a try. Harvest Pack is almost here!

Harvest Pack is back for its 4th straight year at St Jerome's on Wednesday, August 14th from 6 to 8 pm. This year, our plan is to pack 20,000 meals for our food insufficient sisters and brothers in other lands. If we do so, that means we will have purchased and served over 80,000 meals in four years. The cost of each meal is 30 cents, and that goes a long way towards feeding the hungry with a healthy and vitamin enriched rice meal. In order to accomplish this, we need your help. We will be looking for donations to pay for the food to make the meals, and then we need your caring hands to help package the meals. This only takes about 2 hours of your time and before you know it, the work is done and the food is boxed and ready to go to the warehouse until it is shipped to its destination. We would love to have 100 people helping us at this event. Please ask your friends, family members, and neighbors to come as well. The more help we have, the quicker the work gets done. For those who like to use their muscles, we will also be looking for help from 4 to 6 pm to unload the Harvest Pack truck and set up the gym for the food packing. We will soon be having Sign-Up Genius on the parish website for you to sign up as well as a sign-up board at church or you can call the parish office to sign up. A donation page will also be on the parish website. If you would prefer to donate without using the website, please make out a check to St Jerome and put it in an envelope marked Harvest Pack in the collection basket. 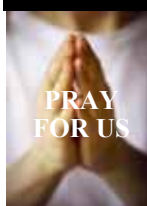
