

MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR



Dear Sisters and Brothers,

WE are grateful to the Lord for the gift of the National Eucharistic Revival that set us on fire again to know and love the Eucharist and affirmed of his real presence in our everyday lives. It was inspiring to hear many touching stories of people's experi-

ences of Eucharistic presence on their lives. It was a once in a lifetime experience to witness such a very moving and faith strengthening gathering of more than 60,000 faithful believers, learning and praying together. It was a historic event in the life of the Catholic Church in the United States.

It is also timely that the gospel reading in next five weeks will focus on John chapter 6 that is known as the Bread of life discourse. It is one of the central passages in the bible that teaches us about the reality of the mystery of the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. So let us walk through our belief of the Eucharistic presence of Jesus Christ beginning with this Sunday's gospel reading.

These are our foundational test on our belief of the Eucharist and his real presence that is the source and summit of our Christian life and worship.

Let us begin with the famous story of the feeding of the five thousand, also known as the story of the multiplication of the loaves. John teaches us that this event is a sign pointing out to a greater reality, the feeding of the all souls in the sacrament of the Eucharist.

Five barley loaves of bread to feed five thousand people? He hear that Jesus gathered the loaves, prayed, gave thanks to the Father. In the Greek bible, to give thanks is "eucharistesas". That is where we get the word Eucharist. Jesus performs the thanksgiving and then gives the bread to the people. There were extra bread of 12 baskets that came from the five barley loves

This reveals something significant to us. The Eucharist is coming from the one loaf from Jesus' table; it's coming from the one sacrifice of Jesus on the cross. The same Eucharist that Christ gives to the apostles at the Last Supper is what he gives to us in every single mass. In the same way that the whole crowd is fed from these five loaves.

We shall endeavor to move forward to understand more about the Eucharist in the four Sundays coming.



Harvest Pack is almost here! Harvest Pack is back for its 4th straight year at St Jerome's on Wednesday, August 14th from 6 to 8 pm. This year, our plan is to pack 20,000 meals for our food insufficient sisters and brothers in other lands. If we do so, that means we will have

purchased and served over 80,000 meals in four years. The cost of each meal is 30 cents, and that goes a long way towards feeding the hungry with a healthy and vitamin enriched rice meal. In order to accomplish this, we need your help. We will be looking for donations to pay for the food to make the meals, and then we need your caring hands to help package the meals. This only takes about 2 hours of your time and before you know it, the work is done and the food is boxed and ready to go to the warehouse until it is shipped to its destination. We would love to have 100 people helping us at this event. Please ask your friends, family members, and neighbors to come as well. The more help we have, the guicker the work gets done. For those who like to use their muscles, we will also be looking for help from 4 to 6 pm to unload the Harvest Pack truck and set up the gym for the food packing.
