Saint Jerome Parish Small Groups (PECS – Parish Evangelical Cells System)

The Archdiocese's formal definition of PECS – Parish Evangelization Cells System

The Parish Evangelization Cells System is a concrete vision for relational evangelization that is rooted in the parish and empowers the faithful to share the Gospel with family, friends, neighbors, and co-workers through small groups called "Cells". ... Indeed, through praise, sharing and the teachings of the pastor, the Cells become a place "where the faithful can communicate the Word of God and express it in service and love to one another; these communities are true expressions of ecclesial communion and centers of evangelization, in communion with their pastors" (Statutes, Ch. 1, Art. 1, Par. 2).

St. Jerome Small Groups (PECS)

Each parish in our Archdiocese is being encouraged to implement their small groups in a way that best meets the needs of that parish community. In the Spring of 2024, St Jerome's began with 10 small groups for people of all ages. We have groups for young adults, young families, Spanish speakers, those employed in healthcare, those who like science, the Filipino/Asian community, retired folks, and the list goes on. Our group leaders would love to have more people in their groups. Additionally, the Parish would like to add more groups to meet the needs and interests of all our parishioners.

What happens in a small group? We start with prayer, and then share what God has done for us or what we have done for God during the week. We have a short church teaching moment along with a discussion about it. We pray for others in our lives and in our small group who need assistance. Most groups limit meetings to 90 minutes. Groups meet weekly, twice-a-month, or monthly. That is what a small group is.

Jesus reiterated God's stance on treating everyone with dignity and care, emphasizing the importance of looking after those in need, including strangers living in our midst, in <u>Matthew 25</u>. He stated, "For I was hungry and you gave me no food, I was thirsty and you gave me no drink, I was a stranger and you did not welcome me, naked and you did not clothe me, sick and in prison and you did not visit me... Truly, I say to you, as you did not do it to one of the least of these, you did not do it to me" (Matthew 25:42–45).

Just as Jesus identified with those in desperate situations, so too are we to identify with others in their need. Sojourners, we can become more empathetic by remembering that we live as sojourners in this world, longing for our eternal home as citizens of God's heavenly kingdom.

To experience God's presence and to continue the communion of sojourners, the group will have the following activities:
