MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

We are now on our third week in reflecting in the "Bread of life" discourse of our Lord Jesus Christ. This is an important study and reflection because this discourse is at the heart of our belief in the Eucharist. Last Sunday we reflected on the exchange


between Jesus and his followers regarding the bread from heaven that nourishes for life eternal and ended with Jesus saying he is the bread of life.
