



Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Many reflections can be drawn out from the wonderful experience of food packing last Wednesday evening at our school gym. Over a hundred of us came to help pack food for the hungry. It is spiritually uplifting to see how we can be bread makers/

givers for others. It is important that we can do something to lift up the lives of the poor. The values that is taught to children by packing food have been planted and we are encouraged to nurture it. Thank you to everyone who came and thank you as well to the Pastoral council that organized the social concerns event.

We look forward to our Fall Parish Festival on Saturday, September 14th. More than just a fund raiser, it is a vehicle to strengthen fraternal bonds and celebrate community. The strength of this event comes from the volunteers and the team work that make things happen. The time and the talents shared build connections. Yes, the presence of each person is what makes the community so active and warm. The value of presence, the sharing of gifts and the communion of faith is what makes us a parish with a common identity in Christ and working for the mission and good.

SCRIP

Summer is going fast. I hope you have been enjoying it. September is right around the corner, and with that, we will be having another physical gift card sale. This is the time to start thinking



about fall purchases you may want to make at Menards, Home Depot or Fleet Farm. Who doesn't like to eat out in the fall? St Jerome earns a nice percentage of sales proceeds when you buy from Outback, Chili's, Olive Garden or Red Lobster. Need to fill-up with gas for trips to the cabin? Kwik Trip gives back 4%

and sometimes 7% on their cards-I always keep \$100 on my card, so I can fill-up when I need to and take home some of their dunker donuts and milk when I pop into the store.

For those of you who have been shopping online with Scrip over the years, thank you! You are the unsung heroes who keep this program going. You would not believe how quickly even small purchases of \$20 or \$25 add up. Cub always gives back 4% or 5%. If you spent \$100 a week on groceries or \$5200 a year, and used a Cub gift card, you would earn a minimum of \$208 a year for church. You can buy a gift card and refill it up to \$1000 maximum, and it will last you for some time. I currently have a Scrip buyer who does this and she loves the convenience of it. Please give it a try.
