



MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR



Dear Sisters and Brothers,

It is indeed a good weekend to celebrate our gift of community at St. Jerome. As today we gather for our parish festival, it is also a good time to reflect about journeying to follow Jesus and the way of the cross. Today we recognize our gift of diversity,

liturgical participation, volunteerism and school ministry.

Jesus asked a very important question about himself to his disciples. They said that other people look at Jesus as more than just an ordinary man as he was identified with the great men of the past like the prophets. But when personally asked "who do YOU say that I am" Peter responded on behalf of the twelve that he was the messiah, the anointed one. Peter's response highlights their faith in Jesus as far as they were engaged with him, live with, heard him speak and witnessed him making miracles. It was a response coming from a time of life journey with Jesus.

Celebrating as a community we are challenged as well to answer that question. We have been journeying in faith and from time to time it is good to ask the question and answer it. Today we happen to remember the feast of the "exultation of the cross", a time as well to reflect how the suffering of Jesus has become a victory for humanity. All these points for reflection are very important for us as a journeying community, following in the way of Jesus. WE desire to follow him and the way that he is teaching us is the way of the cross. We take note that the way of the cross is hard and can be painful but at the end of the tunnel there is the bright light of eternal life that we all desire and is the hope, the courage and the rallying point of our efforts to endure all adversities.

The tension of discipleship and the cross, of following and self denial is a reality in our journey. Many times we can be like Peter who do not want suffering, and avoid inconvenience. He did not like the idea of the cross. We have a mind of our own and we want things to happen just as we want reality to be. The plan of God is for his Messiah to suffer and die. We need to understand that the way of salvation is the way of the cross. "The desire to avoid suffering, the desire of Peter for Christ to avoid his suffering and his passion is in its essence satanic, because it would undo the very mechanism by which God is going to redeem the world and deliver it from Satan and from the power of death. So when Jesus says get behind me Satan, in Hebrew the word satan means adversary" (Petre)

Are we with him or are we going to leave him?

FEAST OF ST. JEROME



Feast of St. Jerome September 30

What do you know about St. Jerome?

St. Jerome was born in Strido, Dalmatia (Croatia) in 347 AD to well-to-do Christian parents. He was educated at home until he was 12 and then was sent to Rome to further his studies. There he learned grammar, rhetoric, philosophy, and literature. While in Rome, his morals lapsed. His guilt over his sinful behavior led him to spend Sundays visiting catacombs to remind himself of his mortality and the prospect of hell. Ultimately, he experienced a conversion and was baptized in 366 by Pope Liberius.

After his baptism, Jerome traveled around to many different communities and Christian sites. He also became a hermit for several years. While in the desert, he studied Greek and learned Hebrew. There, he began translating books into Latin. He likely composed his first work of literature in 374 while staying as a guest of a priest. During this stay, Jerome experienced a dream in which he was brought before a tribunal of the Lord. In the dream, the Judge asked him who he was, to which he responded, "I am a Christian." The Judge accused him of lying and of being a follower of the Roman philosopher Cicero. Jerome realized he was more attached to pagan literature than to the Sacred Word. He vowed to abandon pagan literature, and for many years the dream caused great spiritual crisis for him


