




This week we hear another prediction about the passion and death of Jesus. His disciples did not understand him. It is hard to connect the messiaship of Jesus and his coming death. At this time, they have not yet understood fully what it means to be a disciple. The disciples did not have the idea of the role that suffering and humility plays in discipleship.

But the Apostles today don't understand this second announcement of Christ's Passion. They begin arguing over issues of succession—over who among them is greatest, who will be chosen to lead after Christ is killed.

We have a lesson from Jesus today. Discipleship, as Jesus showed, is leading with love and self sacrifice. We must be willing to become "servants of all", especially to the poor, the weak and the helpless symbolized by the child he embraced. Thus we have to form our hearts to become a heart like Jesus. We have to set our minds to be like the mind of Jesus. If we want to follow him we need to form ourselves to become humble servants. The love of Jesus is sacrificial love.

Our lives will have to be a life of constant formation to seek his wisdom and learn and adopt his humility. We have to form our hearts to become gentle and merciful. Our lives will be a lifetime of formation and learning Jesus Christ.

FEAST OF ST. JEROME



Feast of St. Jerome September 30

What do you know about St. Jerome?

After years spent in the desert, Jerome returned to Antioch where he developed a reputation as a great scholar. There, he eventually was ordained a priest, though with the stipulation that he not be forced to take on priestly duties in order to fully pursue his monastic interests. He spent much time extensively studying the scriptures. In 382, he returned to Rome where he became a secretary to Pope Damasus. He continued his scholarly work, notably using Greek manuscripts to update Latin versions of the Gospels. He also led classes for women who were interested in monastic life, and defended the idea of Mary as perpetual virgin. After the death of Pope Damasus, Jerome left Rome for the Holy Land, discouraged by his belief that the Roman clergy was corrupt.
















ACTs BIBLE STUDY & TRIP TO GREECE
