

MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR



Dear Sisters and Brothers,

This week begins a journey of catechetical instruction and formation for our parish community. Our CCD formation is done every Sunday after our Eucharistic celebration until noon. We live out our prophetic role in spreading the word of God and inculcating the Christian values that Jesus has

taught. We are ever grateful to our volunteer faith formators for sharing their time and faith to our children. Let us always pray for them and for our children. May the Spirit of Jesus live always in their hearts.

We have recently begun our adult faith formation in a bible study of the Acts of the Apostles It is a 24 session bible study and will culminate with a pilgrimage tour to Turkey and Greece tracing the footsteps on St. Paul in Ephesus, Thessalonica and Corinth. It is not yet late to join if you wish to know more about the bible and the growth of the early church. You may wish to join the pilgrimage only. Please check for a flier/brochure about the trip in the church. Let us pray that God will always bless all the faith enriching initiatives of our church community.

We also begin the work of repairs and upgrades of our church facilities. Repairs and renovations have begun at the lower level of the church. Jesus is teaching the indissolubility of marriage therefore divorcing a legitimate spouse is a form of adultery. Jesus is fond of children. They are a blessing. Children are transparent, pure in their love and honest. They have the qualities we need in a marriage covenant relationship. They are free from the addictions of the things of this world that destroy the goodness of man and pervert the mind and heart. They are simple in their relationships and trust is so pure.

We were once children and we have the qualities of a child in our heart. It is important that we rediscover that "gold" in our hearts.
