

MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR



Dear Sisters and Brothers.

Today our church celebrates mission Sunday. We are a missionary church and therefore It is imperative that we are clear of the mission of Jesus of whom we are participants and work effectively to carry out the mission in the spirit and heart of

Jesus. We turn to Mark 10:35-45 and look at what the gospel says and what it means for us today.

We hear the frank and ambitious request of James and John to be given the highest positions of authority in his future kingdom. Did they know what they are asking? Do they know what the kingdom of God is really going to be like?

Jesus' mission is "to save all souls for God's kingdom."

Let us review what it means to be on mission. Let us reflect on the words Jesus uttered: "cup" and "baptism". In mission we must become ready to drink the cup of suffering and be immersed in water, the image for his passion and his death. In mission we must learn to suffer like he suffers, to die as he also dies. That is the way of Christ. Jesus is saying that if we want to be next to him in his kingdom, we must be, like him, an attendant and like a slave to everyone else. We have to become "servant-leaders"

Jesus' leadership is "counter-cultural". It is one that is about becoming a servant for others. Leaders have authority but actually acts as a servant to those they are called to serve. Parents know what this means.

It is good that we are reminded and be formed to what kind of a servant must we become.

"if anyone will come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow me."

This subject is one of the SYNOD Year 2 goals of our parish. Please consider attending.


