

MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR



Dear Sisters and Brothers.

On the fourth week of advent we shall reflect on another very important character in the infancy narrative of Jesus Christ. It is the blessed virgin Mary. She plays a very significant role in the Christmas story and has a very important part in our faith journey.

The gospel story this Sunday give us two indications why Mary plays a significant role in our faith tradition. IN the Jewish tradition and even in many contemporary cultures, it is customary that younger relatives greet older relatives first. The older, have to be recognized and respected. In the case in our story, it is Elizabeth, the older, that greeted Mary, the younger. Because Mary is the mother of the King, and Mary is the mother of the Lord come in the flesh. Mary is the mother of God. Elizabeth is overwhelmed with the fact that she has the honor of the mother of her king visiting her. Elizabeth is humbled by the presence of Mary.

in the Gospel of Luke chapter 11:27-28, a woman is going to say to Jesus, "blessed is the womb that bore you and the breast that nursed you." And Jesus will in turn say, "blessed rather are those who hear the word of God and keep it." Mary is blessed not only because she's the mother of the Lord. She is blessed because she has full trust in the Lord, submitted herself to the plan of God confident that what is said to her is going to happen. At the root of her blessing is because of her faith. What does Elizabeth say? "Blessed is she who believed that what was spoken to her from the Lord would be fulfilled."

These and many more are reasons why Mary has a special place in our heart and in our spiritual journey. We are only three days away from our celebration of the birth of Jesus.

All the stories we hear during the advent season points to the most important figure of Christmas: Jesus Christ who is the fulfillment of God the Father's promise to bring salvation and redemption of the humankind from death restoring us back to life. Merry Christmas, everyone!

Bethlehem: House of bread


