



MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR



Dear Brothers and Sisters.

Pope Francis has declared this year to be a Jubilee Year. It began on Christmas eve of 2024 and will end on the Feast of the Epiphany 2026. It is a special year in our church tradition where the focus of forgiveness, reconciliation, restoration and renewal of faith. It is marked with

opportunities for receiving the sacrament of reconciliation and many ways by which we can come back to God and reestablish a right relationship with him and with our brothers and sisters. In the bible, a jubilee year was a year of liberation and land redistribution, the freeing of slaves and the forgiveness of debts. It happened every 50 years. It can be found in the book of Leviticus.

Our church practice of the Jubilee year happens every 25 years. It is a time of deep reflection, repentance, seeking forgiveness, restoration of broken relationships and healing. It is a time for an increased focus on forgiveness, charity, pilgrimages, special indulgences and healing prayers.

What an opportune it is when our world today is so broken we need healing from our woundedness due to many transgressions. There is a lot of reconstruction, restoration and healing from all kinds of relationships. As a parish let us make use of this year to bring our selves and others to a stronger relationship with God and with our world.

Jesus performs this particular miracle of the wine in Cana, as the first of his signs. The message is that Jesus is the bridegroom. "He is going to redeem us through his love. The cross is going to be an act of love and that's what's going to cover a "multitude of sins" (as Peter says), 'Love covers a multitude of sins'. So it is the divine love of the divine bridegroom that's going to cover our sins. But it's not time for that just yet. He's just getting started with his ministry, so he performs a sign that points forward to what he's going to accomplish, and many of his disciples begin to believe in him."
