MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR



Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Our brothers and sisters who went for a pilgrimage to trace the footsteps of St. Paul in Turkey and Greece have arrived home safe and sound. The trip was very informative and spiritually uplifting learning more and realizing the tough work of evangelization that St. Paul did. One can only wander with admira-

tion and inspiration the faith of St. Paul and his commitment to a joyful proclamation of Jesus and the good news of salvation. Until you have visited the places where he travelled, preached and at times persecuted, you wouldn't get a deeper sense of the life of St. Paul. Our pilgrims are so grateful for so many parish members who prayed for their safety and the success of their pilgrimage. How blessed we are!

What is this love that Jesus wants us to possess and especially share with our enemies? What does loving your enemy means? For Jesus, love is not "just" a feeling. We may feel in love but love is not a feeling. To love means making a choice and a decision to give one's self, even expanding beyond our limitations or boundaries for the good of the beloved. It means willing to make a sacrifice for the sake of the loved one.

Moving further to love our enemies entail good actions. "I will do good to someone who hates me. So even though they hate me, I don't return "eye for eye" or "tooth for tooth" (I don't return evil with evil), but they give me evil and I return it with a good action. So the first way we show love for our enemies is to do good to them. It doesn't say anything about feelings. The emphasis is on actions." (*Pitre*)

The love that Jesus invites us, in our time, is radical. It is love when we make the conscious decision and choice to 'pray for those who persecute you. It does not come natural to us to pray the rosary and to "will" the good of the person who hurt us. That is what "agape" is. That is what prayer is.

Lord, teach us how to love.

With the help of an interpreter, I was able to tell them about their grandchildren...their personalities, how kind they are, how he or she is doing in school, how she has such a beautiful laugh and smile...grandparents' love for their grandchildren is universal, and it crosses many miles. Below is a picture of a grandmother that I got to visit with about her grandsons Lupway D. and Andrew (Lupway D. is on the far left).



When I returned it was so fun to share pictures with our students. Many of our current students were born in the refugee camps. These camps are a temporary place for families who have had to flee Myanmar because the government wants to rid the country of the Karen. Though temporary, many families have been here, waiting to relocate for between 1 and twenty-five years. We are hopeful that in the next 1-2 years additional families will join our Catholic Karen community here in St. Paul and join our school.





Many of you purchased gift cards in December. Did you know the majority of them are reloadable? What that means is you can add more value to the card at any time. As an example, I have a Kwik Trip card I use

for gas and groceries. It started out as a \$50 card and each time I refill it now, I add \$100 value to it. What is really great is that I try to wait until Scrip has a special deal with Kwik Trip and I am able to make \$12 for the church every time I refill my card. A real no brainer. Every time I use the card, I know I am making money for the church without spending anything extra. I have a customer that started out with a \$100 Cub card. When it is time to reload her card, she adds \$1000 to the card, earning \$40 or \$50 dollars for the church. These amounts really add up. I use my Kwik Trip card like I would a credit card. I just put the card in at the pump like I would do with a credit card. If you would like to do this but don't know how, just email me or call the church office and I will walk you through the steps.
