Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Once again we enter into the season of lent bringing along with us another jubilee of mercy, a time of forgiveness, healing, reconciliation and renewal. We take on the theme "Pilgrims of Hope". We are pilgrims. We are on a spiritual journey towards our salvation.

Hope gives us the reason to endure and to persevere. Because there is mercy, there is hope. This Jubilee encourages us to engage another season of lent. Solution Many of you purchased gift cards in De-De cember. Did you know the majority of them are reloadable? What that means is you can add more value to the card at any time. As an example, I have a Kwik Trip card I use

for gas and groceries. It started out as a \$50 card and each time I refill it now, I add \$100 value to it. What is really great is that I try to wait until Scrip has a special deal with Kwik Trip and I am able to make \$12 for the church every time I refill my card. A real no brainer. Every time I use the card, I know I am making money for the church without spending anything extra. I have a customer that started out with a \$100 Cub card. When it is time to reload her card, she adds \$1000 to the card, earning \$40 or \$50 dollars for the church. These amounts really add up. I use my Kwik Trip card like I would a credit card. I just put the card in at the pump like I would do with a credit card. If you would like to do this but don't know how, just email me or call the church office and I will walk you through the steps.
