





When do you like to pray? Is it in the morning, at night, morning and night? Where do you go when you want to pray? What special place is there?"

During this season of Lent, it is good to intensify our prayer. It prayer when we listen in the word of God and engage him in our hearts. Jesus liked to get away from the crowds, to be in solitude and engage with his father, and to pray on the

One significant lesson we learn from the story of the transfiguration is that fact that the event is a foretelling for the resurrection that is to come. It is a foretaste of the glory of the resurrection where the righteous will shine like the sun; they will be like stars in heaven. Since ancient times, the transfiguration of Jesus has been understood as a kind of foretaste of the glory of the resurrection.

It is a joy indeed for the three privileged disciple to experience the divinity of Christ. The transfiguration of Christ is the taste of glory that is Christ's and ours in the resurrection.
