

MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR



Dear Sisters and Brothers.

During this period of penance it is good to look at the teaching of Jesus about the importance of repentance.

During Jesus' time, if a person experiences a tragedy or suffering or death, people would as-

sume they "they must have done something wrong and they're getting their punishment now through this physical tragedy or this physical suffering."


Jesus says, "No, that's not the case but unless you repent you will all likewise perish." It is not assumed that an unfortunate, unexpected death is necessarily the result of a particular sin. However, Jesus is saying, "If you don't repent, you too will perish." If death is not necessarily a result of sin, then why will I perish if I don't repent? Jesus is not talking about the loss of physical life rather of spiritual death where we are excluded from the kingdom of God because we have not repented of our sins. That's when we perish.

As in the parable of the fig tree Jesus is teaching us that any tree that "doesn't bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire." The tree symbolizes any individual sinner who is in need of repentance and who needs to bear fruit through good works. Anyone who cannot bear good fruit because of sin is like a fig tree that's going to be cut down and thrown into the fire. The fire is a symbol for the unquenchable fire we call Hell, a separation from God and an exclusion from the kingdom of God.

The lack of fruit represents the state of sinfulness and the lack of repentance. The ability to do good works are the signs of repentance and the state of grace.

Every Lent season is an opportunity to cleanse our sinful soul and strengthen it with God's grace. In our bulletin this week we insert a flier for opportunities for reconciliation in our area.


