


MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR



Dear Sisters and Brothers.

It was very touching and encouraging so many of us spent an hour or two with the Lord in the blessed Sacrament last Sunday. It manifests our being a praying and adoring faith community. It was good as well to see children in the assembly, an opportunity for them to experience and appreciate our ways of worship. It

was great time to pray and savor the saving and life giving love of the Father. We shall continue this new tradition of offering the opportunity for silent prayer in the blessed sacrament during the season of Lent.

This Sunday we shall also do our send off ceremony for our candidates for confirmation. It is this tradition during the Eucharistic celebration that we call on the parents to bring and light the baptismal candles of their children Lit from the Paschal candle, it symbolizes the light of Christ entering the child's life and the flame of faith that should burn brightly throughout their life, reminding parents and godparents of their role in nurturing the child's spiritual journey. Now that they are about to the confirmed, that candle is offered to their children as a sign that they have now to continue that journey of nurturing their hearts as they move on in the spiritual journey after confirmation.

The story of the woman caught in adultery should not be only focused on women but to all, including men. The mercy of God is overflowing that in the midst of a person's weakness we have a God. It is good to reflect: "Is God condoning the sin of the adulteress by not having her put to death?" Isn't God being a little too lenient here with what is obviously a very serious sin? Adultery is a grave sin. It not only violates the Ten Commandments, it breaks the marital covenant, it destroys families; it destroys homes. Think of all the human pain and suffering and tears and heartache and children who've been hurt by the sin of adultery. This is a very serious sin. How can Jesus just let the woman go and say, "Go and sin no more."? What do we make of this act of our Lord?

"Go and sin no more." You see then that the Lord does indeed pass sentence, but it is sin he condemns, not people.






