MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR



Dear Sisters and Brothers,

We continue to celebrate and savor the wonderful gifts of love and life our Lord Jesus Christ gave us. In celebration we show our appreciation, our gratitude and our valuing of these gifts. We take time to pause and breathe in the positive energy of his love and life that

nurtures deep inside us, the spirit of being loved and hope in life. We are strengthened by his gifts to endure and overcome all trials that may come in our life.

On the octave of Easter we celebrate the unfathomable mystery of God's mercy. We commonly call it Divine Mercy Sunday. We will hear the famous story of the doubting Thomas, the power of reconciliation, the confession of sin, and the profession of faith. SCRIP

Hi Shoppers-

Do you know you don't have to wait until our next physical gift card sale to purchase physical gift cards? That is right, Scrip/Raiseright makes it easy to pur-



chase a physical gift card and have it sent to the comfort of your home for a small fee. If you are comfortable using apps on your smartphone, you can easily do this. You simply download the Raiseright app through either the Apple Play store or the Google Play store. After you do this, the app will walk you through how to set up an account if you do not have one already online. You will pay for your gift card with either a credit/debit card or your checking account, and then are able to shop and see what cards are available to order online. Delivery time takes about a week and the cost to mail a card to your home depends on the amount and number of cards you buy.

If that sounds like too much work, and you are fine with receiving a paper (e-gift card) (not for use at gas stations or grocery stores) and are not set up online, just email me and I can order what you would like. If you ordered say a \$50 Olive Garden e-gift card, just give the paper to your waitress and you can even pay for your tip on this. You will either get the gift card back with the balance, or they will toss the ecard if you used the card up. I can easily order that for you online and you can pay at the church office or place your payment in the collection basket with your payment in a envelope marked, "Scrip." THE HOLY WATER

Holy water is a powerful symbol of grace and blessing. It is one of our symbols of faith, a visible sign of God's grace to humankind through the years. The waters that flowed from the rock quenched the thirsting Israelites and saved them from death. In the rivers of Jordan the Jews received the grace of repentance and cleansing. Water that flowed from the side of Christ was a symbol of new life given after the sacrifice of Christ. The water in baptism cleanses us from our sins to make us become worthy children of God. Water is life.



When we make the sign of the cross with water it reminds us of our baptismal identity and the grace of life. The gesture speaks a lot about faith, of devotion and grace and protection. Because water is a sacred symbol of God's life and salvation, we use holy water also as protection from the evil one. The blessing of things with holy water comes from the faith that those that are touched by holy water are touched with the life giving grace of God. Holy water connects all these things to the memory and mystery of our involvement in the life of Christ in the Church."
