


MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR



Dear Sisters and Brothers,

We are now at the height of our Easter Celebration remembering the day when the apostles of Jesus witnessed his ascension into heaven. While we take time to reflect on the death and resurrection of Jesus, the story of the ascension of Jesus completes and

brings to a high point our celebration of the mystery of the resurrection. Traditionally this is celebrated forty days after Easter Sunday. It usually falls on a Thursday but in many dioceses throughout the United States, the feast (the solemnity) gets moved to Sunday so that the greater community and join in the celebration.

The very important message of Jesus on his Ascension day is about the mission of evangelization, bringing the Good News of his Passion, Death, Resurrection and the forgiveness of sins to all the peoples of the world, starting with Jerusalem. They are to give witness to this and so are we.

As we read closely what Jesus said about evangelization, Jesus talks about "bringing the gospel", "bearing witness to the Good News of his Resurrection, his Passion and Death", you'll notice what he says that repentance (number 1) and forgiveness of sins (number 2) should be preached in his name. It is important to point this out because it's easy, in our modern day, to forget that repentance from sin is an essential part of the gospel. That is absolutely fundamental.

The celebration of Ascension is a joyful celebration not just because it proves the truth about Jesus but more importantly it gives us a clear message of the mission of the church. We are called to become "witnesses" of the good news and to be examples of conversion, "a change of heart".


