

MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR



Dear Brothers and Sisters,

This 4th Sunday of Easter is often referred to as "Good Shepherd Sunday". Here's one more teaching about Easter: Discipleship. we're going to take one of the teachings of Jesus from John 10. It's Jesus' famous declaration: "I am the good shepherd" and "I and

the Father are one", this is a revelation of his divinity. He compares himself to the shepherd and his disciples to the sheep.

Significantly he teaches us about discipleship: his sheep (disciples) hear his voice. Shepherds lead their flocks using their voice. The shepherd makes certain calls to the sheep and the sheep learn to know the shepherd's voice, and that's how they follow him. Just as the sheep recognize the voice of the shepherd and listen to the voice of the shepherd, so too his disciples hear his voice and they obey what he says.

A shepherd spends day and night with his sheep, week after week, year after year, he gets to know the sheep. He gets to know each one of them by name and he recognizes who they are. So, on one level that's the meaning of his words. Jesus too knows each one of his disciples. He knows each of his followers intimately. He knows who they are. He has a relationship with them.

The sheep follow him. It's a path that a person choose to walk. The sheep (disciples) obey what he says and go where he goes. The way is wide and easy that leads to destruction and the way is narrow and difficult that leads to life." Morality isn't just a series of abstract propositions that we either keep or don't keep, rather it is a path; a daily journey we take step-by-step.

Here's the meaning of what he says: "come, follow me."

SCRIP

Hi Shoppers-

Do you know you can order physical gift cards for a small fee? That is right, Scrip/Raiseright makes it easy to purchase a



physical gift card and have it sent to the comfort of your home for a small fee. If you are comfortable using apps on your smartphone, you can easily do this. You simply download the Raiseright app through either the Apple Play store or the Google Play store. After you do this, the app will walk you through how to set up an account if you do not have one already online. You will pay for your gift card with either a credit/debit card or your checking account, and then are able to shop and see what cards are available to order online. Delivery time takes about a week and the cost to mail a card to your home depends on the amount and number of cards you buy.

If that sounds like too much work, and you are fine with receiving a paper (e-gift card) (not for use at gas stations or grocery stores) and are not set up online, just email me and I can order what you would like. If you ordered say a \$50 Olive Garden e-gift card, just give the paper to your waitress and you can even pay for your tip on this. You will either get the gift card back with the balance, or they will toss the ecard if you used the card up. I can easily order that for you online and you can pay at the church office or place your payment in the collection basket with your payment in a envelope marked, "Scrip."
