




MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR



Dear Sisters and Brothers.

We are only two weeks away from the conclusion of the Easter season so let us take this time to savor some more of the teachings of Jesus during the last support evening. We sometimes like to call it the farewell teachings of Jesus. They are, when we reflect on it closely, very personal

teachings to his disciples about the unity of the Father and the Son and the revelation of the Holy Spirit.

The reality of the triune God (Holy Trinity) is the central mystery of our Christian faith. It is the mystery of who God is in himself. Take note of Jesus' revelation in the gospel reading this Sunday.

We are now introduced to the third person in the Trinitarian reality of our God.




The Resurrection with Dr. Michael Barber

Jubilee Year Indulgences

During a Jubilee Year, the Catholic Church grants special plenary indulgences, which offer full remission of the temporal punishment due to sin. These indulgences are a manifestation of God's mercy and are particularly relevant during the <u>Jubilee Year 2025</u>. To earn an indulgence, Catholics generally need to perform acts like <u>pilgrimage</u>, reconciliation, <u>Eucharistic celebration</u>, <u>prayer</u>, and <u>works of mercy</u>.

Archbishop Bernard Hebda outlined four steps the faithful could take to participate as "Pilgrims of Hope" and in the grace of indulgences that are promised.

- ➤ Undertake a pilgrimage to the Basilica of St. Mary in Minneapolis or the Cathedral of St. Paul in St. Paul; or engage in an act of charity for migrants, the elderly, someone in prison, living in poverty or in some other area of need.
- ➤ Make a sacramental confession
 - o Detachment from all sin, even venial
- ➤ Attend Mass and/or receive Holy Communion
- ➤ Offer prayers for the intention of the Holy Father
 - o Our Father and Hail Mary suggested

<u>Indulgences</u> can be either *partial* or *plenary*:

- <u>Partial indulgences</u> typically involve fewer spiritual and corporal works of mercy and assist in remitting some of the temporal punishment of sin.
- <u>Plenary indulgences</u>, on the other hand, because they involve more extensive internal and external works, can remit all temporal punishment for sin.
