




MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR



Dear Sisters and Brothers,
We endeavor to reflect and catechize ourselves to another important tenet of our faith: The most holy Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ. This Sunday we celebrate this solemnity giving thanks to God for the gift of the Eucharist, the body, blood, soul and divinity of Jesus Christ that was given to us for

the first time at the Last Supper, and then is given to us every time the mass is celebrated throughout the world. This teaching is the source and the summit of the Christian life.

The miracle of the multiplication of the loaves: no matter how many times the two fishes and five loaves of bread was broken into pieces there was enough to feed five thousand people. That is a miracle of multiplication. In fact there were twelve baskets full of fragments left over!

It is not just a multiplication miracle. It is a Eucharistic miracle! Similar to the last supper Jesus takes the bread, he blesses the bread, he breaks the bread and he gives the bread,” are the same four Greek words. This is an anticipation to what Jesus is going to do at the Last Supper. To us, it is another point to our belief that Jesus did intend to institute the Eucharistic meal.

We shall continue to endeavor to teach our belief in the Eucharist. Jesus died for us and invites us to remember, celebrate and receive him as he said in the last supper, “this is my body... this is my blood...do this in memory of me.” We believe that he is truly present, soul and divinity in the Eucharist.

We look forward to the parish garage sale on Wednesday and Thursday. This is a simple fundraising to help support the pastoral ministries of our faith community. We appreciate the initiative and the efforts of our volunteers organizing this event. This is also the week when all the arch-diocesan priests gather for their Presbyteral Assembly at St. Mary’s University in Winona on Monday till Thursday. Please include them in your prayer intentions.

Veterans Collection—starting July


Every Third Saturday is a Veteran support organization located near the VA Hospital are in need of used men's and women's summer clothing:


