


MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR



Dear Sisters and Brothers
 Summer have started and on Tuesday we will cross half way through the year. Significantly it also begins my second term as Pastor of St. Jerome. There are so many good gifts we have received from God as his faithful disciples and so it is always good to give thanks to the Lord. As we continue our faith journey we rely on God's direction and grace. Let us pray ever fervently that we are able to hear his word and follow where to leads us to go. There are definitely some challenges ahead yet we are courageous because God is with us. AS Paul said in his letter to the Romans 8:31 "If God is with us, who can be against us?" Let us keep the faith and keep our prayers.

It will be a good listen this Sunday and reflect what does it mean for Jesus to the Christ and Messiah and what does it mean for us to "follow him" as his disciples. Peter professed that Jesus is "the messiah". He is the promised deliverer of the Jewish nation, a leader and a savior. He is "Christos", the anointed one, the consecrated and the anointed one, chosen for a very special purpose: deliverer and savior.

Most importantly Jesus pointed out that as a messiah it means he will be willing to embrace suffering and willing to give up his life as an offering for the release of God's people. He is going to be rejected by the elders and chief priests, and that eventually he'll be killed and rise on the third day after his death. This is a very important description by Jesus of his "messiahship"

Then follows Jesus' invitation to discipleship, to follow him. Jesus is quite honest in outlining the conditions of discipleship: denying oneself, taking up one's cross and that's how we follow him.

Indeed, to be his disciple is a personal choice and decision, willing to reorient one's way of thinking and values, priorities and desires and open to the possible consequences for giving up something, endure trials, suffering even death. To sum it up all, commitment, letting go of self-centeredness and conversion of heart.

Instructions for how to set up SCRIP so you can both purchase or reload your cards at home.



- Type in *Raise Right* on your web browser
- Click on *Join an existing program*
- Enter enrollment code B89AB59714377
- Click on *enroll* button
- Type in your first and last name only and click *next*
- Add your email and create a password
- Pick your 2 security questions and fill in your answers
- Set up your recovery phone (your mobile phone) and click on *what method you prefer-text or phone call and then you will receive a 6 digit code you will enter*
- Click on *get started*

YOU CAN ONLY ORDER EGIFT CARDS OR RELOAD NEW GIFT CARDS BOUGHT THROUGH RAISE RIGHT DURING ONE OF OUR PHYSICAL GIFT CARD SALES. YOU CAN NOT ORDER A PHYSICAL GIFT CARD THROUGH THIS SITE BECAUSE IT WILL COST THE CHURCH \$11 TO HAVE IT MAILED TO CHURCH AND WE WOULD LOSE MONEY.


