







WELCOME TO THE CHURCH OF ST. JEROME

MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR



Dear Sisters and Brothers,

We continue to learn from Jesus about discipleship. The story of Martha and Mary teaches us about the two essential aspects of spiritual life: Contemplation and Action.

In contemplation we reflect/ponder on the mysteries of God, his love, truth and justice. As Christians we are called to put into action the lessons we learn and the relationship that is established in our contemplation. The love of God calls us to love our neighbor in service. The phrase "the love of God impels us" originates from St. Paul in his second letter to the Corinthians (5:14). This verse tells of the transformative power of Christ's love that moves believers to live a life dedicated to Him in the service of others. It's not a forced compulsion. It is a powerful, inner motivation driven by love. This is a very good and important reminder for us. Without love we will not be able to endure.

Jesus is teaching us the values of discipleship and hospitality. Mary represents discipleship and Martha represents hospitality. In the hierarchy of values Jesus is teaching us that discipleship is of higher value. In our spiritual life we must place it in our hearts that there is no action without contemplation nor can there be a meaning and value to contemplation if there is no action. Both are important components to faith.

Jesus is warning us about the tendency to be distracted by the many things in the world that make us anxious. We need to pray. We need to pause and sit at the foot of Jesus and listen.

St. Benedict said "hora et labora". He tells us that in our life the hour for prayer and labor should go together.

Let us live out this teaching of Jesus Christ as St. Benedict did.



Instructions for how to set up SCRIP so you can both purchase or reload your cards at home.




- Type in *Raise Right* on your web browser
- Click on *Join an existing program*
- Enter enrollment code B89AB59714377
- Click on *enroll* button
- Type in your first and last name only and click *next*
- Add your email and create a password
- Pick your 2 security questions and fill in your answers
- Set up your recovery phone (your mobile phone) and click on *what method you prefer-text or phone call and then you will receive a 6 digit code you will enter*
- Click on *get started*
